OkayFreedom is a VPN service enabling Internet users to privately and securely surf all web content -- free and uncensored -- regardless of their geographic or physical location. The software also enables individuals to protect their online identity and activities while using public WiFi. OkayFreedom employs a network of encrypted, worldwide servers that direct data traffic. "While we condemn any form of religious desecration or illegal activity, we also oppose Internet censorship, which is taking root in various places around the world," said Gabriel Yoran, managing director of Steganos Software GmbH. "We're committed to keeping the Internet freely accessible and online activities private for users worldwide," he added.

Steganos is extending its free one-month premium code offer through the end of this year to up to 10,000 users, whether they be residents of affected countries or expats residing there. The premium code entitles them to freely surf up to 5 GB of Internet traffic within the one-month period.
